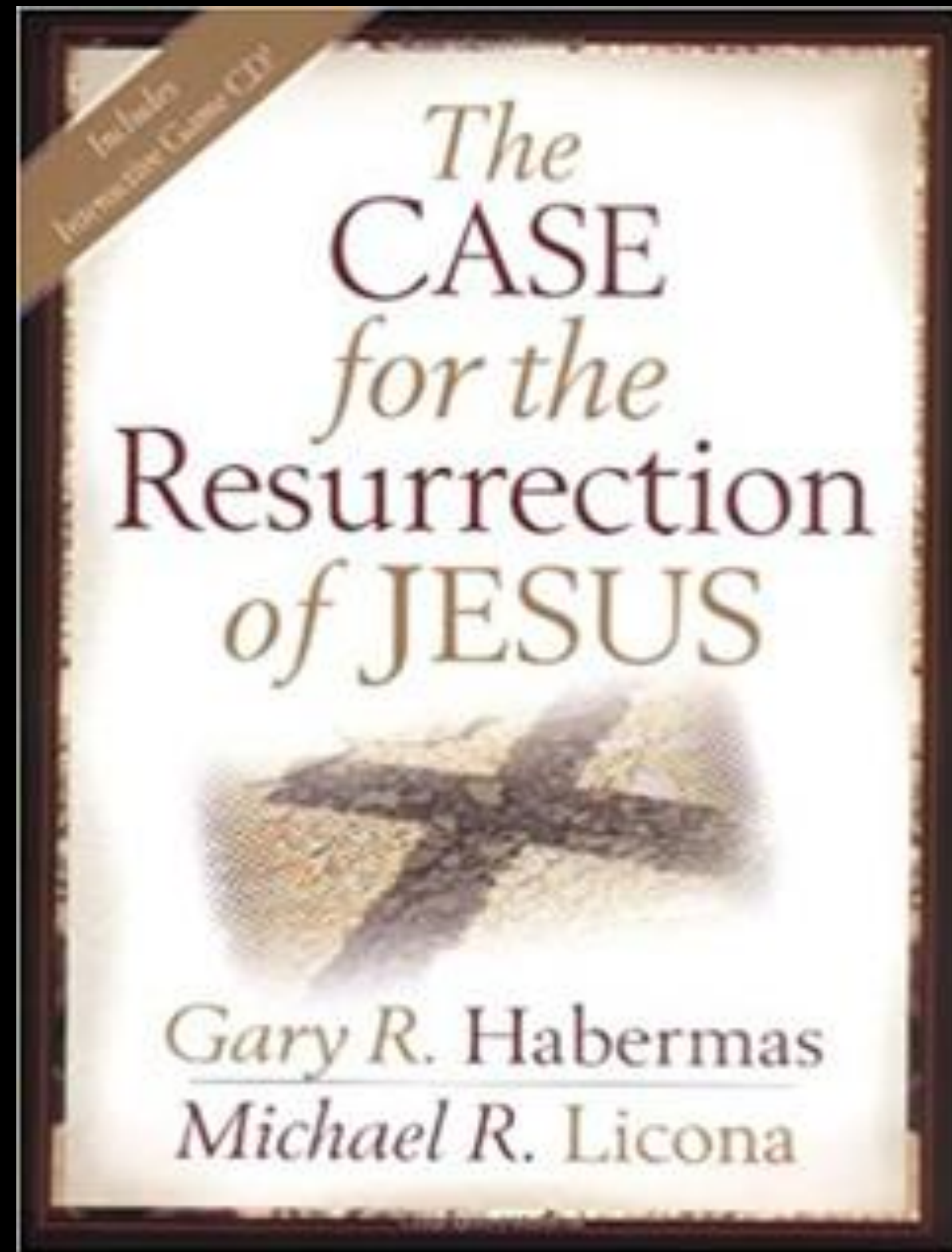

Gary Habermas' Minimal Facts

1. Jesus died by crucifixion.
2. He was buried.
3. His death caused the disciples to despair and lose hope.
4. The tomb was empty.
5. The disciples had experiences which they believed to be the risen Jesus.
6. The disciples were transformed from doubters to bold proclaimers.
7. the resurrection was their central message.
8. They preached the message of Jesus' resurrection in Jerusalem.
9. The church was born and grew.
10. Orthodox Jews who believed in Christ made Sunday their primary day of worship.
11. James was converted when he saw the risen Jesus (James was the family skeptic).
12. Paul was converted (Paul was an outsider).
