

Gary Habermas' Minimal Facts

- 1. Jesus died by crucifixion.
- 2. He was buried.
- 3. His death caused the disciples to despair and lose hope.
- 4. The tomb was empty.
- 5. The disciples had experiences which they believed to be the risen Jesus.
- 6. The disciples were transformed from doubters to bold proclaimers.
- 7. the resurrection was their central message.
- 8. They preached the message of Jesus' resurrection in Jerusalem.
- 9. The church was born and grew.
- 10. Orthodox Jews who believed in Christ made Sunday their primary day of worship.
- James was converted when he saw the risen Jesus (James was the family skeptic).
- 12. Paul was converted (Paul was an outsider).
