World War Will End at 6 o'Clock -This Morning; Armistice Signed By Germany.

CONDITIONS TO BE ANNOUNCED LATER

Known That Army Must Disarm and Demobilize; Stragetic Points Will Be Occupied; Fleet To Be Given Up.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 11.—The world-war will end this morning at 6 o'clock Paris time. The armetica was signed by the German representatives at midnight. This announcement was made by the state department at 2.50 o'clock this morning.

The announcement was made exchally by an official of the state department in this form:

"The armistice has been signed. It was signed at 5 o'clock a. m., Paris time and hostilities will peace at 11 o'clock this morning, Paris time.

The terms of the armistice, it was annunced, will not be made public until later. Military man here, however, regard it as certain that they will include: lossediate retirement of the German military forces

from France, Belgium and Alexa Lorraine.
Disarming and demobilisation of the armire.

Occupation by the allied and American forces of such strategic points in Germany as will make impossible a renewal of heatilities.

Delivery of ports of the German high seas fleet and a certain number of submarines to the ellied and American navel forces.

Discreament of all other German warships under superirision of the allied and American navies which will guard them.

Occupation of the principal German naval bases by see forces of the victorious nations.

Release of allied and American addiers, sailors and civilians held prisoners in Germany without such reciprocal action by the associated governments.

There was no information as to the circumstances under which the armistics was signed, but since the German courier did not reach German military handquarters until 10 o'clock posterday morning. French time, it was generally assumed here that the German energy within the Franch lines had been instructed by wireless to sign the terms.

Furty-seven hours had been required for the courier to reach German headquarters and unquestionably acceral hours were necessary for the examination of the terms and a decision. It was regarded as possible, however, that the decision may have been made at Berlin and instructions transmitted from there by the new German


