Zechariah 9.13-15



Maccabean Revolt

> 175 BC Seleucid King—

Antiochus IV (Epiphanes) (the "little horn" of Daniel 8:9) issued decrees forbidding Jewish religious practice.

> 167 BC Uprising—

Led by Mattathias, a faithful priest, against the pagan Greek influences of the Selucid Empire. Continued by his son Judas Maccabeus ("the hammer").



Maccabean Revolt

> 164 BC Rededication of Temple—

After three years, the Jews are able re-conquer Jerusalem. The Maccabees then purify the Temple and rededicate it from its desecrations.

> Origin of Jewish Observance of "Hanukkah"—

With little oil for the lampstand, they use what they had, and it stayed lit for eight days—until additional oil can be pressed and delivered to the Temple.


Intertestamental Period Maccabean Self-Rule in Israel

140 BC Hasmonean Dynasty—

"The Hasmoneans fought off Hellenizing influences and paganism, defeated the evil Antiochus Epiphanes, secured Israel's independence ... and, at least temporarily, restored the glory of Israel as a nation."


63 BC Herodian Dynasty—

"Antipater, was a chief adviser to the Hasmoneans and established a good relationship with the Romans. His son (Herod the Great) convinced the Senate of his sincere intentions and he eventually was installed as king of the Jews, ending Hasmonean rule. Agrippa II was the last of the Herodians.



John 11.47-48

"Then gathered the chief priests and the Pharisees a council, and said, What do we? for this man doeth many miracles. If we let him thus alone, all men will believe on him: and the Romans shall come and take away both our place and nation."



Zechariah 9.16 - 10.1

"And the LORD their God shall save them in that day as the **flock** of his people: for they shall be as the stones of a crown, lifted up as an ensign upon his land. For how great is his goodness, and how great is his beauty! corn shall make the young men cheerful, and new wine the maids. Ask ye of the LORD rain in the time of the latter rain; so the LORD shall make bright clouds, and give them showers of rain, to every one grass in the field."
