Chapter 1:

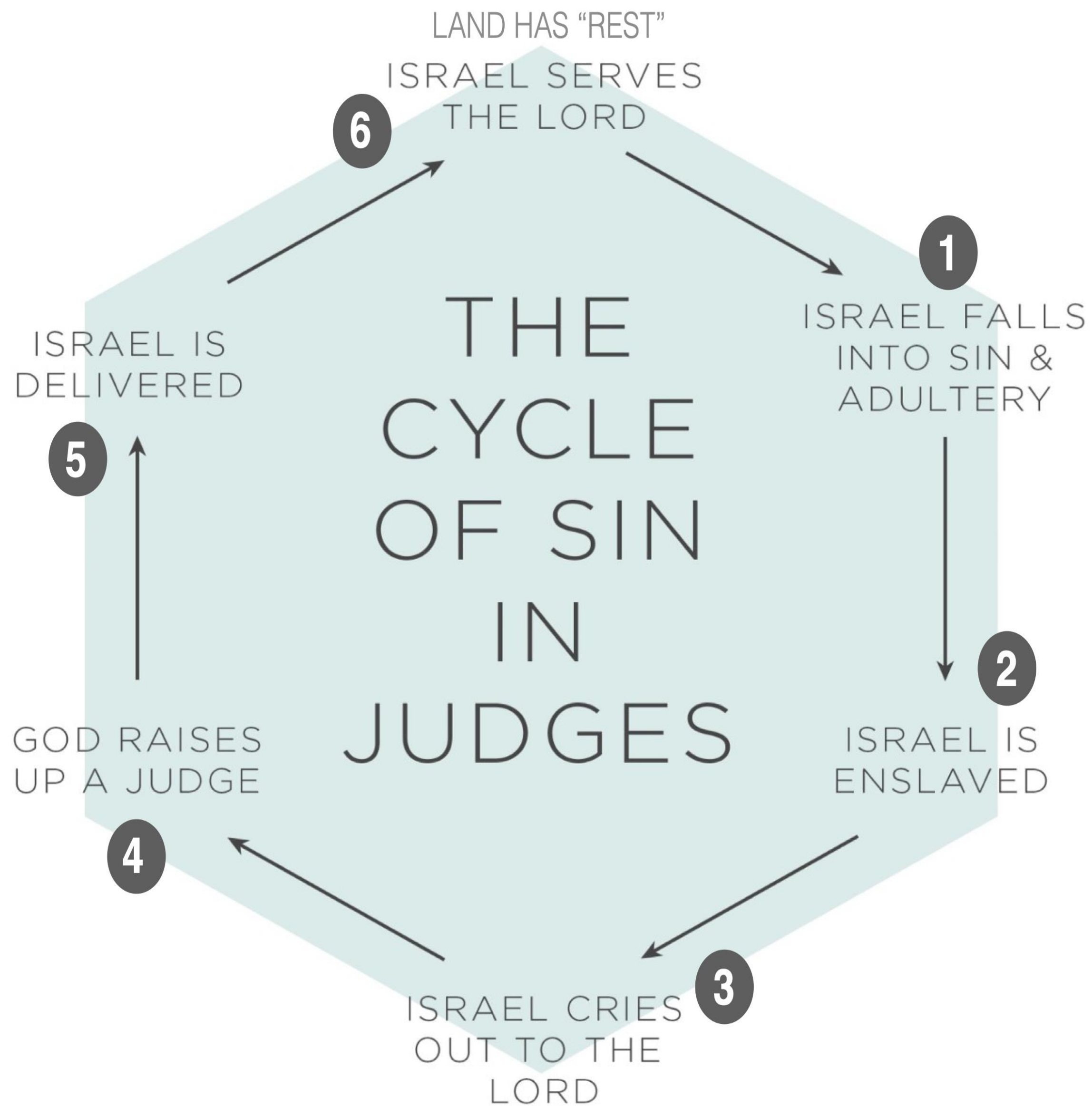
Provides the “why” Israel did not complete the task of taking the land.

Chapter 3:

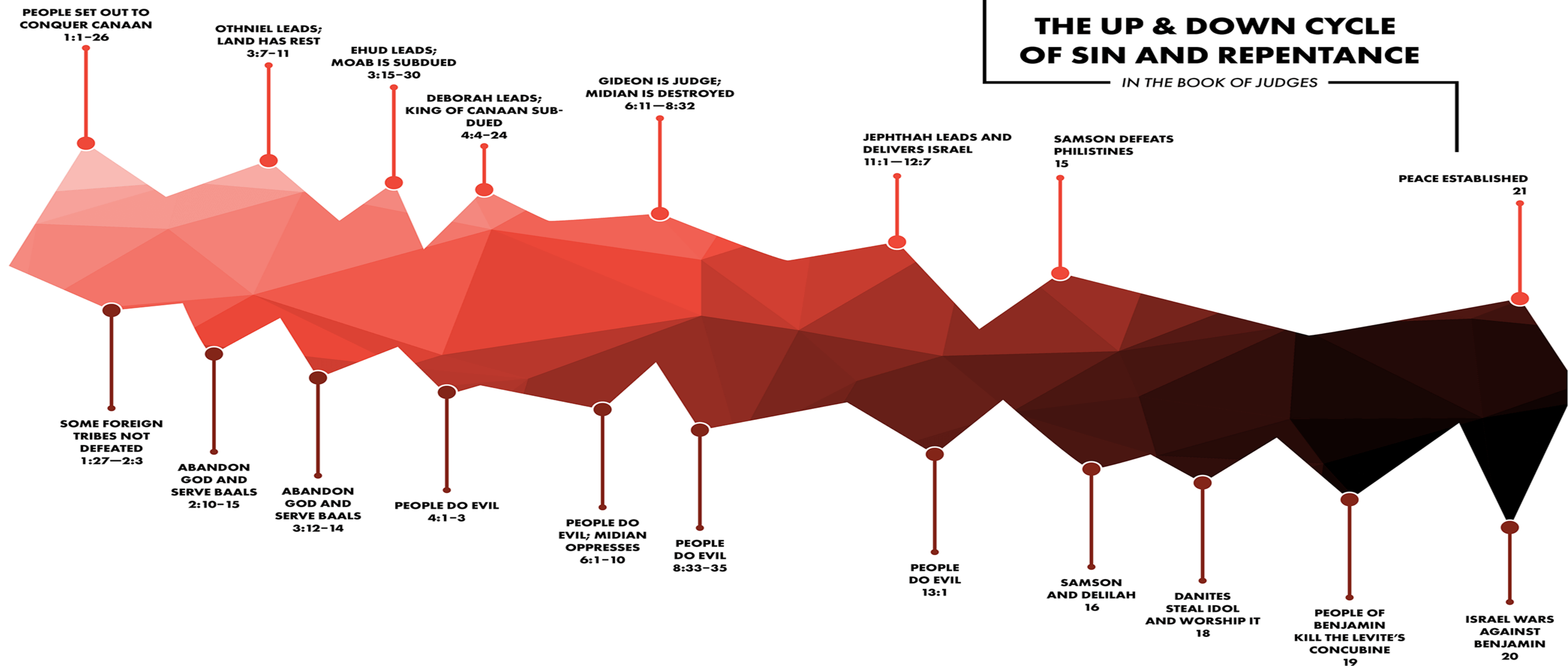
Beginning of “Israel’s Woes” and the Cycles of Deliverance.

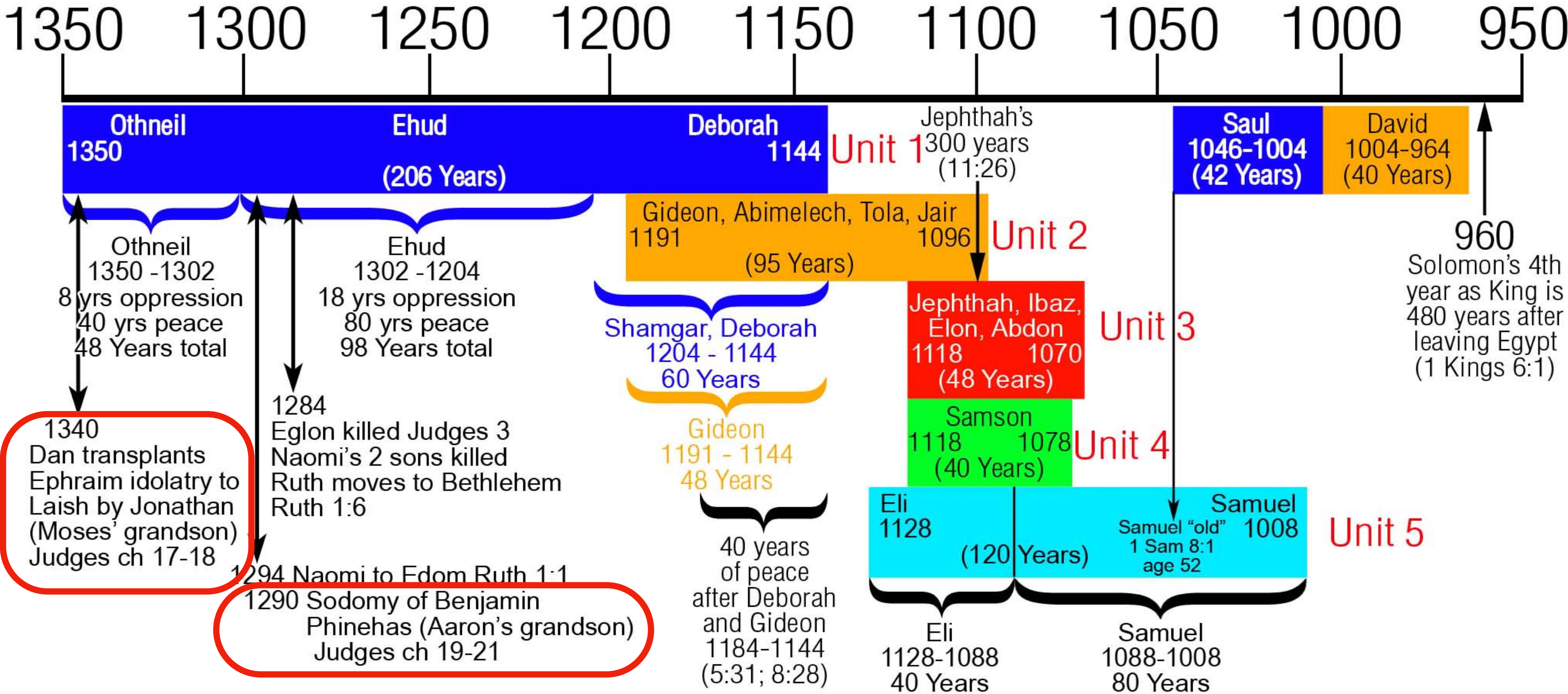
