

Chapter 1:


Provides the "why" Israel did not complete the task of taking the land.

Chapter 2:


Gives a clear reasoning for God's later judgement. Provides a theological summary of the events of the rest of the book.

Beginning of "Israel's Woes" and the Cycles of Deliverance.







DEBORAH AND BARAK

- City
- ▲ Mountain peak
- Canaanite forces summoned to Megiddo to fight against Israel (Judg. 4:2, 12; 5:19; 1 Sam. 12:9)
- Israelites rally to Barak at Kedesh-naphtali and engage the Canaanites in battle (Judg. 4:10; 5:14f)
- Canaanite confederation moves from Megiddo and attacks Barak near Mt. Tabor (Judg. 4:13ff)
- Canaanites routed; their chariots get stuck in the Kishon River (Judg. 4:16; 5:21; Ps. 83:9)
- Sisera flees on foot, but is killed by Jael (Judg. 4:15ff)
